EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 011

AN ORDER MANDATING ALL BARANGAY OFFICIALS, INDIVIDUALS AND INSTITUTIONS OF BOTH GOVERNMENT AND PRIVATE SECTORS TO CONDUCT INTENSIFIED CLEAN-UP OPERATIONS IN THEIR RESPECTIVE JURISDICTION/OFFICES/HOMES AND OBSERVE ALL-OUT MEASURES FOR THE CONDUCT OF "TODAS DENGUE, TODO NA TO (IKA-ANIM NA KAGAT)" TO STOP THE SPREAD OF DENGUE FEVER AND OTHER MOSQUITO-BORNE DISEASES IN THE CITY OF ILAGAN

WHEREAS, it is a declared policy of the State to uphold the people's right to life, health, safety and security and promote the general welfare of the community;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of Republic Act 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, grants every local government unit the power necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare, ensuring and supporting the promotion of health and safety and preserving the comfort and convenience of all inhabitants;

WHEREAS, in support to the aforementioned Executive Order No. 03-2019 issued by the Provincial Government of Isabela, the City Government of Ilagan urges the participation of the community in the conduct of a city-wide clean-up activity in the City of Ilagan as preventive measure to address the spread of dengue and other diseases in the barangay/purok level;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSEMARIE L. DIAZ, City Mayor of the City of Ilagan, Isabela, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law do hereby order:

Section 1. Conduct of Clean-up Drive in 91 barangays of the City of Ilagan.

An intensive Clean-up Drive shall be conducted thoroughly in all communities and neighbourhood comprising all 91 Barangays of the City of Ilagan. All Punong Barangays are directed to lead, with the active participation of all barangay and SK officials, in the implementation of the following:

- a. Removal of mosquito-breeding places and water-collecting receptacles like old tires, tin cans, plastic containers, etc., which collect stagnant waters and may cause the spread of disease and contamination (i.e.: dengue and leptospirosis) in all barangay roads;
- b. Cleaning of all barangay roads, most especially the streets that encourage the breeding of mosquitos;
- c. Dredging/cleaning of clogged canals, esteros, gutters, drainages and other waterways;
- d. Pruning/cutting of tree branches, leaves, and tree foliage that may be possible mosquito hiding places;

- e. Conduct massive public information dissemination campaign on Dengue Awareness and aggressively advocate to their respective communities its active participation in the campaign against Dengue;
- f. Constant monitoring of all affected families/households and immediate reporting of status to the City Government;
- g. Coordinate with the City Government on the recording and reporting system for vector control and surveillance information on Dengue;


Section 2. *Involvement of individuals and institutions, both government and private sectors.*

All residential home owners and tenants, schools, commercial/business establishments, including market vendors, industrial, agricultural, private and government institutions are required to conduct clean-up activities in their respective area to destroy mosquito breeding sites, reduce the incidence of dengue fever and prevent deaths resulting from mosquito/water-borne diseases such as Chikungunya and Zika, and ensure the safety of all Ilagueños from such diseases;

Section 3. *Effectivity.*

This order shall take effect immediately.
